Our Mission

Sandford Park School's mission is to educate its Irish and international students in a safe, disciplined and caring environment. Our aim is to prepare them to be responsible citizens. We equip our students with the skills to enable them to think creatively, reason critically and communicate effectively. Excellent teachers

As a school founded by teachers, Sandford Park is truly committed to progressive teaching methods and continuous professional development. As well as being passionate and committed to the full and rounded education of their students, our highly experienced teachers continue to explore their particular subjects and interests. The ambience of a small class allows staff to interact individually with each student, addressing their difficulties and feeding their curiosity as appropriate.

Committed mentors

Ours is an environment in which the teacher's role goes far beyond the boundaries of the classroom. In addition to their involvement in pastoral care, teachers bring their own individual interests, skills and expertise to bear on co-curricular activities, thereby enhancing each student's

holistic educational development. Their consistent flexibility and willingness ensures they are available to parents and students for advice, support or discussion throughout the term, and not just at parent teacher conferences.



Curriculum

Sandford Park School offers a broadly-based, challenging and liberal education. There are two class groups per year and high priority is given to academic excellence as we prepare our students for the Irish state examinations 'Junior Certificate' and 'Leaving Certificate'. We are experienced in helping students from all over the world make a successful transition into the Irish education system.

Junior Cycle

While the Junior Certificate syllabus is important in its own right, it is also the point in a student's development where he/she is exploring their options and opportunities for the future. To facilitate this, Form I exposes students to a wide range of subjects, allowing them to make an informed choice

about those they wish to carry forward to the Junior Certificate exams. This is where the seeds of academic excellence are sown, where ambition and interest in a subject take root. The overwhelming majority of subjects sat by Sandford Park students in the Junior Certificate are taken at higher level.

Senior Cycle

Transition Year

Transition Year is a compulsory element in the curriculum of Sandford Park, forming an essential part of each student's education. The programme is built around a range of academic, personal, vocational, social and cultural activities. These activities draw on the wealth of skills and talents available among teachers, providing students with challenging and stimulating experiences. Excellent resources and effective co-ordination result in a superb learning atmosphere and foster a sense of enjoyment and engagement in learning. Throughout Transition

Year, students continue their regular studies in the core subjects: English, Irish, Maths and French, so as to maintain the momentum towards the Leaving Certificate. In addition, they sample options outside the standard curriculum. In recent years these have included architectural studies, debating, film studies and Russian. Then there are the activities which promote active citizenship and involvement in the local community: participation in the Sandford Social Innovator programme; fund-raising and working with a nominated charity; work experience placements; and

participation in the President's/Gáisce Award - to bronze level. We encourage students to pursue this to gold level. Continuous assessment is a key component of Transition Year and reporting to parents is comprehensive. The programme is continually evaluated so that changes can be made to further enhance the learning experience in subsequent years.

Leaving Certificate

The Leaving Certificate is a two year programme. From the outset, teachers, students, guidance counsellor and parents/guardians, work together as a team on subject options, career guidance and ongoing progress, to ensure each student is best placed to achieve their maximum potential. Teachers are available to parents

throughout the year, for discussion or advice. The majority of Leaving Certificate exam papers are taken at higher level. As our goal is a fully rounded education, a careful balance is struck between the rigours of academic study that leads to a career and the cocurricular activities that equip a student for life. As the Leaving Certificate is recognised by universities worldwide, Sandford Park attracts a strong international contingent, further broadening the experience and perspective of students and teachers alike. We consistently have pupils from the USA, Canada, Scandinavia and elsewhere in Europe, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and Africa, whose parents have chosen Sandford Park because of the options it opens up for their sons and daughters.

Sport

Sport and physical activity play a significant role in the life of the school. We encourage all students to participate in team sports and to embody the Corinthian spirit: Mens sana in corpore sano. A sports council, composed of students, staff, parents and board members meets regularly to manage policy and further enhance the performance and enjoyment of sport within the school.

Sandford Park offers a number of representative team sports: rugby, hockey, basketball, cricket, tennis and badminton, led and trained by experienced coaches who have played at high levels themselves. Students also have access to volleyball, a running club and keep fit classes.

In recent years, Sandford Park has won the Senior Leinster Schools
Development Cup in Hockey, the
Senior Alf O'Connell Cricket Cup and reached the final of the JCT Rugby
'Leinster Shield' and U13 Harry Risk
Cricket Cup Final. We have links with a number of institutions, including
YMCA Cricket Club, Wanderers RFC and UCD, whose first-class facilities are available to the school.





Music

Music is at the heart of the Sandford Park School experience. We are proud of our outstanding reputation for music in the curriculum, choral work and instrumental tuition. In Form I, all students have the opportunity to study music. They can also choose from a wide range of instruments, all taught on a one-to-one basis. Facilities are world class and include acoustically engineered practice rooms and a state-of-the-art music centre. Senior, Junior

and Girls' choirs, Samba Club, Orchestra and other instrumental and vocal ensembles give students many opportunities to perform and to compete, locally, nationally and internationally.

Music Department trips abroad have been a feature of recent years. These have included choral projects in Calgary, Chicago, Washington D.C. and Boston.

Debating

Structured debate is an entertaining and highly effective way of developing articulacy, oration and communication skills, and is an activity close to the heart of the school.

There are both Junior and Senior debating teams. In 2013 the senior and junior teams reached the All Ireland semi-final of the Gael Linn competition. In 2011 the senior team had the unique distinction of winning both the National Concern debating title and the Gael Linn debating title. In 2010 the senior debating team reached the Concern All Ireland semi-final and won the All Ireland title in 2009. In the same year the junior debaters reached the semi-final of the UCD L&H competition.

We have also been successful in the International Observer Mace competition, the Mental Health competition, the European Council invitation event, the Model European Parliament and the Model United Nations. In their determination to do so, Sandford's panel of speakers commits an extraordinary amount of time and energy to research, rehearsal and debate.

Drama

Forms 1, 2 and 5.

While drama is an integral part of the English curriculum, it is the annual school production that gives many students the opportunity to be part of one of the truly special events of the school year. The school has an outstanding reputation for its highly professional and entertaining productions.

Traditionally, Transition Year students provide the nucleus of the cast and support crew, but auditions are also open to

Past productions have included Broadway showstoppers West Side Story and Guys and Dolls, Hollywood classics The Wizard of Oz, Twelve Angry Men and A Man for All Seasons, and Shakespeare masterworks Midsummer Night's Dream, King Lear and Much Ado About Nothing.

Students are encouraged to become involved in all aspects of the productions, from on-stage acting parts to production design, costuming, set building, lighting and sound.

The school also provides on-going support for students working towards accredited drama examinations




Leinster School of Music and Drama, the Royal Irish Academy and the Irish Board of Speech and Drama.
